

VILLAGE IMPROVEMENT SOCIETY TO BE FORMED

Systematic Betterment at Forest Home Is the Object in View

Forest Home, May 7.—At the close of the school meeting at Forest Home on Tuesday evening, the residents of the village were asked by A. J. Lamoureux to remain a short time to consider a proposition for the organization. He explained and betterments in the shape of footpaths, shade etrees, road improvements, etc., if carried out in accordance with a common plan, would add greatly to the beauty of the place and to the value of its property. He did not ask the village to enter into any scheme for spending money for improvements beyond what would a naturally made by the residents themselves, but he thought that were an intelligent plan adopted, such as might be drawn up by a landscape artist, these expenditures from year to year could be made in accordance with such plan and lead to better results. He believed that help in this respect could be obtained from use Department of Landscape artist, whose students have already made several plans for the improvement of Forest Home. Professors Warren, ...neeler and others supported the suggestion, and acessrs. Lamoureux, Wheeler and Guthrie were chosen to prepare a plan for an organization, win the understanding that a meeting will be calle at an early day for its consuceration.
